# District Grants Leaflet



# INTRODUCTION

Each year the District has funds available to distribute in the form of grants and loans to support the mission and work of churches and circuits across the District. Funds are obtained by submitting a request to the District Property and Finance Executive using the appropriate application form.

Members of the P&FE are keen to see 'all' the available funds distributed and being used to actively support mission across the District. However, we also recognise that we are stewards and need to ensure that the funds are being used appropriately. We have produced this guide to provide further information on available funds and processes.

Members of the P&FE and the Evangelism and Justice Team are also available to provide support with initial discussions and/or applications, so don't hesitate to get in touch.

# **APPLYING FOR A GRANT**

When applying for **any** grant funding your application will need to be persuasive and show how the financial support will make a difference. Follow the five key principles below to create a strong application to the District and other funders.

#### 1. Prepare well

Before you start applying for any type of grant, it's important to be prepared and ensure the basics of your project are covered. Make sure your church/circuit has considered the fundamentals, before you sit down to write any applications. You need a strong vision, which clearly expresses what your church/circuit would like to achieve with the funds raised.

## 2. Well-thought-through proposals

You need to make a compelling and clear case for support which conveys the **need** for your project, what your solution to the need is and what outcomes your solution will provide. (Consider expected impact and measures of success, both quantitive and qualitative (hard and soft).

- **Data** use data to support your application and be clear on its source.
- **Partnerships and consultation** appropriate partnerships may increase the chances of an application being successful as will consultation with

community and subject experts. This is great evidence when applying for a grant as to why your project is needed.

#### 3. Well written applications

Make the application easy to read and set out in a succinct and logical format. Be careful to avoid jargon – it can be extremely helpful to get someone unrelated to the project to proofread.

External funders are unlikely to know your church/circuit and will make a judgment based on what is written, so first impressions are important. Your application will need to persuade the panel of the value of your project and its chances of success in meeting its objectives.

# 4. Well-rounded applications that include all the key information

Make sure your proposal has covered the key points including the need for the project, the solution your church/circuit is offering and what the outcomes will be. How will you evaluate success?

Ensure all paperwork is correctly completed and include a full breakdown of all costs involved. Make sure that you attach/include any specific documentation that is requested, eg audited accounts.

#### 5. Remain positive

The outcome of applications for district funds will be notified to you by the District Grants Officer. If your application is declined, you will be given the reason and feedback on further actions you might take.

Applications to external funders may also be declined. Even if you receive a 'no' to your application, it may not mean 'no' forever. It's normal to get several 'nos' before you get a 'yes', so remain positive. An application to a well-researched grant funder is never wasted, especially if you receive feedback from the funder.

# WHAT DISTRICT FUNDS ARE AVAILABLE?

District grants are allocated from two main sources:

**District Advance Fund** – available to support church, circuit and district 'mission and community' projects. Most of the money available is typically allocated to personnel rather than property. However, applications can be made for help with new buildings or alterations which enable a church to be used in a more mission-oriented way.

**District Capital Fund** – this was established in 1992 from Circuit contributions. By using it to support posts with a District-wide remit, we are keeping to the spirit of the original funding.

In addition, there are currently two other funds available:

Purley Gardens Fund – specifically for innovative missional projects

**District Aid Association Fund** – loans can be obtained at a low rate of interest, repaying regularly for up to five years.

District Funds should be regarded as supporting a scheme which has been strongly supported locally and by the Circuit, covering up to 33% of the project costs, although this can be higher depending on various factors. Grant applications can be spread up to five years. For church applications, the norm is 33% from Circuit and 33% from local church. If it's a circuit application, is the proportion 50:50?

**Please note** that grant applications for amounts under £1,000 should be made using the Small Grant Application Form which can be obtained from the District Grants Officer, Mrs Margaret Graham. (Contact details as above.)


